From seed funding to cures

Seed funding is what turns a revolutionary hypothesis into a lifesaving treatment.

Since 1998, HMRI supporters have provided seed funding for thousands of discoveries. We are now world leaders in the following areas:

Stroke

HMRI's stroke researchers developed the telestroke service that is now in use around Australia. The service helps regional clinicians determine whether patients require clot-busting medication or clot retrieval surgery, ensuring patients get the right treatment faster.

Cancer

From discovering chemotherapy drugs that don't damage the heart, to understanding the difference between an aggressive tumour that will metastasise and a tumour that won't change, our researchers have made extraordinary progress. They are also working on early detection tests and genetic testing to speed up the time to effective treatment.

COVID-19

HMRI's infection researchers, working alongside Australian Biotech ENA Respiratory, have played a key role in development of a nasal spray that could be used to protect against respiratory viruses including SARS-CoV-2, the cause of COVID-19. The spray has successfully completed a clinical trial in the UK with people infected with influenza virus and planning is underway for a second clinical trial aimed at preventing respiratory illness in older people.

Stillbirth

HMRI's Mothers and Babies researchers discovered a cause of stillbirth and are developing diagnostic tests so that women at risk of stillbirth can be identified and monitored to improve the chances of a safe delivery.

Asthma

Our researchers created game-changing treatment strategies for patients with severe asthma and created the guidelines for severe asthma and asthma in pregnancy that are now used worldwide.

Diabetes

HMRI has partnered with the Public Health Network and Hunter New England Health on the Diabetes Alliance Program Plus (DAP+). The objective is to upskill GPs and allied health professionals in remote and regional areas, where patients have limited access to specialist services, to better treat diabetes so it doesn't escalate and cause more serious complications.

From research lab to world-first clinical trials

At the heart of every groundbreaking medical discovery lies a pivotal moment—an initial spark that sets the course for change. One such moment happened at an HMRI gala dinner when early-career researcher Professor Darren Shafren shared his visionary idea with Greater Building Society CEO, John Arnold.

Professor Shafren's concept was revolutionary: could the common cold virus be trained to kill cancer cells? Inspired by the potential, John Arnold made a \$25,000 seed donation, enabling Darren to begin his research. That initial funding catalysed years of work that proved the virus could indeed destroy cancer cells without harming healthy tissue.

This remarkable discovery led to the formation of Viralytics, a biotech company that caught the attention of a global pharmaceutical giant. Today, Phase II clinical trials of this groundbreaking therapy are underway across the globe, offering new hope to cancer patients.

And it all started with \$25,000.


